TAYLOR MAC: A 24 DECADE HISTORY OF POPULAR MUSIC

Glittering New York performance artist **Taylor Mac** is the darling of the US cabaret scene, hailed as its bedazzled shaman, radical angel and searing social critic. With **A 24-Decade History of Popular Music**, he has sculpted his magnum opus, a highly immersive and outrageously entertaining crash course in the 240 years of the history of American culture and dysfunction.

This once-in-a-lifetime event is a decade-by-decade walk through America from 1776 to 2016, told through the songs of the time, reinterpreted through a radical queer lens, and told from the perspective of groups whose stories are often forgotten, dismissed, or buried.

It was awarded the 2017 Kennedy for Drama Inspired by American History - last year's winner was Lin-

Manuel Miranda, the creator of the musical *Hamilton* - and was a finalist for the 2017 Pulitzer Prize for Drama.

The Kennedy prize jury called **A 24-Decade** "a vast, immersive, subversive, audacious and outrageous experience," that uses a variety of techniques to "explode our country's history" and show, in Mac's words, how "in America the oppressor is forgiven but the outsider is vilified."

Co-commissioned by a number of international partners including Melbourne Festival, this concert will be presented as four six-hour Chapters in the glorious surrounds of the newly-restored Forum Theatre. Making its world premiere in New York before touring to San Francisco, this very special Melbourne performance marks its third ever appearance.

Chapter I (1776-1836): Wed 11 Oct - The American Revolution from the perspective of the yankee doodle dandy, the early woman's lib movement, an epic battle between drinking songs and early temperance songs.

Chapter II (1836-1896): Fri 13 Oct - Walt Whitman and Stephen Foster go head to head for the title of Father of the American Song culminating in the queerest Civil War Reenactment in history.

Chapter III (1896-1956): Fri 20 Oct - A Jewish tenement, a WWI trench, a speakeasy, a depression, a zoot suit riot all make the white people flee the cities.

Chapter IV (1956-the present): Fri 20 Oct - Bayard Rustin's March on Washington leads to a queer riot, sexual deviance as revolution, radical lesbians, and a community building itself while under seize.

As you'd expect for a job this big, Mac's brought a few friends along for the ride, including an orchestra — led by music director Matt Ray, who created new arrangements of all 246 songs — plus an ensemble of "Dandy Minions" and more than 100 special guests, acrobats, burlesque performers, puppets, choirs and marching bands supporting the cabaret icon fearless — or foolish — enough to embark on such a crazy quest.

But always magically present is Mac, decked and bedazzled in gloriously irreverent regalia, created by long-time fellow traveller and costume provocateur, Machine Dazzle.

From murder ballads to speakeasy swingers, Women's Lib anthems to Walt Whitman, this is a show 240 years in the making and 24 hours in the telling. Far from a durational performance, it is a communal exercise that squares off against the country that declares itself the greatest democracy the world has ever known, but that isn't short on skeletons in and out of the closet.

Part celebration, part exorcism, all party, this extravaganza will take its place as one of the most spectacular moments Melbourne has ever witnessed.

The Inauguration

Less an 'abridged edition' and more of a 'live and unplugged,' The Inauguration is Taylor Mac and five special international guests taking audiences on a whistlestop tour of 240 years of American music in under two hours. Get up close and personal in an intimate stage show that flows freely across the centuries, alighting at key moments to form a musical portrait that captures the tumultuous spirit of the country forever changing. Featuring songs from Mac's full marathon production in new arrangements alongside others improvised on the night, The Inauguration will be take place at Hamer Hall, Arts Centre Melbourne.
